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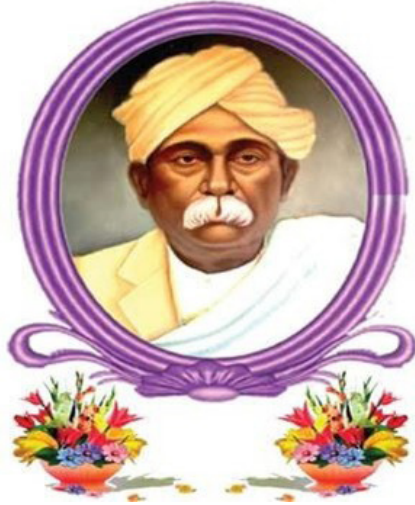

The Sangha started “Bachelor of Arts” programme in June 1982 to provide an opportunity to the students to pursue higher education in the field of their choice. To commemorate the contribution of the Founder towards education, in the same year the college was renamed as “Shree Tammanappa Chikodi Arts and Commerce College”.

Keeping in view, ample employment opportunities in the corporate world at middle and lower-level management arouse and hence, the Sangha started “Bachelor of Business Administration” programme in 1999.

With the constantly changing educational landscape and an increase in global opportunities in the field of I.T., in 2001 “Bachelor of Computer Applications” programme was offered. This gives an opportunity to the rural students to acquire knowledge in the modern and advanced field of computer applications and computer technology. In 2008, Master of Commerce and 2014 Master of Arts in English and Bachelor of Science course were also added.
